

## AB-3032: Hospitals Maternal Mental Health Act

- It requires all birthing hospitals in California to provide education and information to postpartum people and their families about maternal mental health conditions, post-hospital treatment options, and community resources.
- All regular staff in labor and delivery departments (e.g. registered nurses and social workers) must receive education and information about maternal mental health disorders.
- Hospitals can offer additional services to ensure optimal care.

Law became effective on January 1, 2020.



# **Levels of PMH Programming**

**PMH 101:** Deployment of training – online or other.

**PMH 102:** Documented policies and procedures regarding patient and provider education, including a list of referral resources.

**PMH 103:** Implementation of comprehensive education, screening and referral program for maternal mental health disorders, including data collection.





## % of Patients Receiving Education Prior to Discharge


• 47% of respondents said their hospital reliably tracks which patients have received education about perinatal mental health disorders.

→ 53% do not reliably track

• Among those who track, 85% say that "most" or "all" patients receive some form of education.





## **Screening and Referral**

	<u>YES</u>
Hospital screens women in the perinatal period for mental health disorders?	83%
Hospital has written procedures and protocols in place about screening and referrals?	32%
Hospital reviews data on screening rates?	31%

Of those who review data, 80% screen all patients








## Hospital Offers Referral Information to Patients
