

Mandatory Health Equity Reporting Coming Soon – HQI Can Help

WHAT'S COMING •
Beginning in September 2025, **all hospitals and health systems (including acute care and acute psychiatric hospitals)** must submit detailed equity reports to the state containing:

- **Eleven structural measures (1,800+ data fields to complete!)**
- **Nine stratified core quality measures (across nine stratification variables!)**
- **Rate ratios of stratification groups**
- **A comprehensive health equity plan**

Background: Assembly Bill 1204 was passed in 2022 and requires comprehensive health equity reporting by hospitals to the Department of Health Care Access and Information (HCAI); **the first report is due Sept. 30, 2025.**

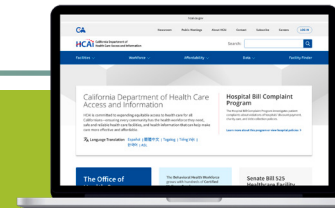
